The second instalment of Rs. 25,000/- will be released on receipt of the following documents that may please be submitted within two months after holding the seminar:

**I. Two complete sets of Reports (hard bound copies) of the seminar/Conference that should necessarily constitute of the following:**

- The List of the Actual Participants of the seminar.
- The exact titles & presenters of each of the session.
- 2-3 paragraphs write-up on seminar topic.
- Full Proceedings as presented in the Seminar alongwith the abstracts.
- A note on the contribution of the seminar to the existing body of research.
- The Convener shall acknowledge support of ICSSR in all publications resulting from the seminar outcome (Books, Articles, Reports etc.) and should submit a copy of the same to the ICSSR after the completion.

**II. The audited head-wise statement of accounts and utilization certificate in GPR (form 12A) (copy enclosed) for the entire expenditure incurred from the sanctioned amount. Both these needs to be duly certified by the Convener, Registrar/Principal, and the Finance Officer in case of the Central University or the Chartered Accountant in case of other institutions.**

Kindly ensure that the **Utilization Certificate** and the **Statement of Expenditure** must be duly verified and properly stamped by the Principal/Registrar/Head of the Institution and the Finance Officer/Chartered Accountant as the case may be. Audited Statement of accounts with Utilization Certificate in GPR-12 form is for the entire seminar grant approved by the ICSSR.

The above documents are mandatory requirement to settle the account and enable us to release the final installment.

The following are the other conditions that shall be complied with:

- The financial assistance should be utilized for the purpose for which it has been sanctioned.
- A part of the assistance is to be utilized for publication of the proceedings of the seminar
- On International travel (not more than 25% of the total budget) is to be allocated.
- Obtaining MEA Clearance wherever necessary is the responsibility of the organizers
- The amount sanctioned herein is to be utilized on the proposed conference only within the stipulated period.
- In case the Convener does not submit the full proceedings and reports on completion of the seminar, the scholar may be debarred from availing all future financial assistance from the ICSSR.
- Any amount of the assistance remaining unspent during the current financial year shall be refunded to the ICSSR immediately after completion of the seminar/conference. If the organization do not refund the amount in time, it will be required to refund the amount of the grant with interest thereon @ 10% per annum from the date of release of grant from ICSSR.
- As per the directives from the Government of India, all the payment are to be made by **e-payments** only. Kindly furnish the information in the PFMS form duly verified by the administrative head of the Institution/University & College after ensuring that the account has been linked with the ICSSR.



# REPORT

## DAY 1 (01-03-2023)

The two-day national seminar sponsored by ICSSR was organized at School of Pedagogical Sciences, MGU on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of March 2023. This comprised of four thematic sessions, five parallel sessions and ten paper presentation venues including two done in online platform. 124 papers were presented in the seminar and the seminar was graced by the presence of more than 324 participants and presenters from various institutions.

## REGISTRATION

Two-day National Seminar Sponsored by ICSSR was held at School of Pedagogical Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam started on March 01, 2023 with the registration process at 09:30 am.





## INAUGURAL SESSION (01/03/2023 at 10:00am)

The National Seminar started with a prayer song sung by the School Choir in the seminar hall of School of Pedagogical Sciences at 10:00 am. The convenor of the seminar, Dr. Smitha S., Assistant Professor, School of Pedagogical Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi University extended her formal welcome to the dignitaries and delegates and also introduced the theme of the seminar. Prof. (Dr.) Asha J.V., the Head of the School of Pedagogical Sciences, presided over the inaugural function of the seminar. After the thematic presentation, a discussion session followed. Prof. Dr. Jaya Jaise presented a memento to Prof. Dr. Mohandas B Menon. Sr. Bindhumol T, Research Scholar proposed the vote of thanks and the session was adjourned for lunch at 12:50 pm. The entire events were documented by Ms. Sheril Sara Thomson, M. Ed Student.

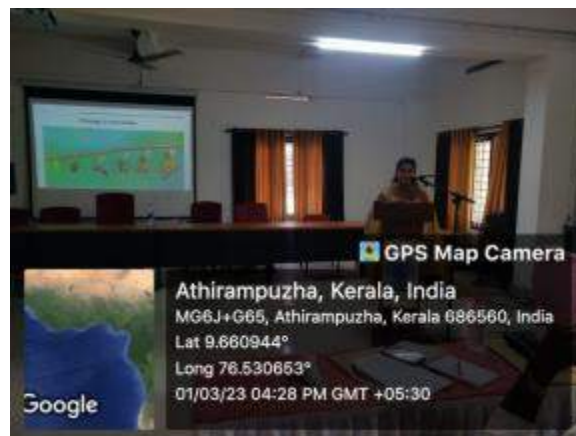

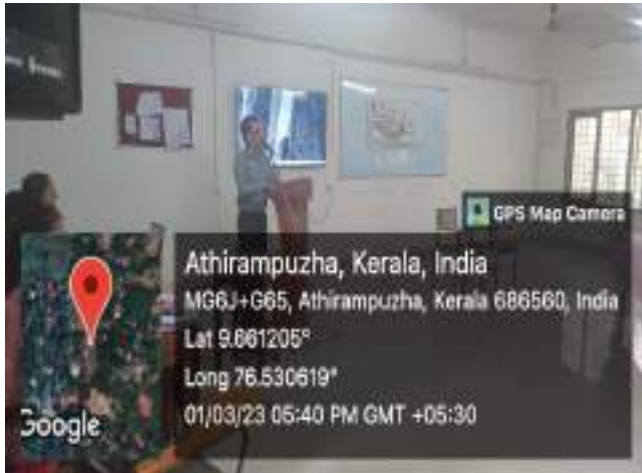
## **Venue -2**
