 - Pull Proceedings as presented in the Seminar alongwith the abstracts
 - A note on the contribution of the seminar to the existing body of research.
 - The Convener shall acknowledge support of ICSSR in all publications resulting from the semanar outcome (Books, Articles, Reports etc.) and should submit a copy of the same to the ICSSR after the completion

II. The audited head-wise statement of accounts and utilization certificate in GFR (form 12A) [copy enclosed) for the entire expenditure incurred from the sanctioned amount. Both these needs to be duly certified by the Convener, Registrar/Principal, and the Finance Officer in case of the Central University or the Chartered Accountant in case of other institutions.

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REPORT

DAY 1 (01-03-2023)

The two-day national seminar sponsored by ICSSR was organized at School of Pedagogical Sciences, MGU on 1st and 2nd of March 2023. This comprised of four thematic sessions, five parallel sessions and ten paper presentation venues including two done in online platform. 124 papers were presented in the seminar and the seminar was graced by the presence of more than 324 participants and presenters from various institutions.

REGISTRATION

Two-day National Seminar Sponsored by ICSSR was held at School of Pedagogical Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam started on March 01, 2023 with the registration process at 09:30 am.







INAUGURAL SESSION (01/03/2023 at 10:00am)

The National Seminar started with a prayer song sung by the School Choir in the seminar hall of School of Pedagogical Sciences at 10:00 am. The convenor of the seminar, Dr. Smitha S., Assistant Professor, School of Pedagogical Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi University extended her formal welcome to the dignitaries and delegates and also introduced the theme of the seminar. Prof. (Dr.) Asha J.V., the Head of the School of Pedagogical Sciences, presided over the inaugural function of the seminar. She talked about the need for fruitful deliberations where there is room for opportunities to find areas of strength and weakness. Prof. (Dr.) C.T. Aravindakumar, Hon'ble Pro-Vice Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam inaugurated the session by lighting the lamp. In his inaugural speech, he mentioned the relevance of knowing what our national symbol, national flag and national anthem are. He spoke on how technological booms have reflected on the economy and education in India. He mentioned the rich population of youth in India. This implies that teachers have to tune and mould them. He ended his speech quoting Gandhiji's words, "Live as if you were to die tomorrow, learn as if you were to live forever." There is a need to support the learners as if the society is to sustain forever. By these words he declared that the National Seminar was inaugurated. Also, he initiated the release of the e-book of the Compendium of abstracts of papers which are going to be presented in the Seminar. Prof. (Dr.) Jaya Jaise, Formerly Head and Dean, Faculty of Education, Mahatma Gandhi University addressed the gathering about the need and significance of seminars and projects. Prof. (Dr.) Sajna Jaleel, Professor, School of Pedagogical Sciences felicitated the gathering, reminding that the rate of education was only 3% at the time of independence. The inaugural session ended with the vote of thanks proposed by the faculty member Dr. Muhammed K.V, Assistant Professor, School of Pedagogical Sciences followed by the session break for tea. The inaugural session had been compered by Ms. Divya Martin, Research Scholar and Ms. Reshma Elizabeth Rosh, MEd student, and was documented by Ms. Sheril Sara Thomson, M. Ed student.

































THEMATIC SESSION 1 (01/03/2023 at 11:30 am)

After the Inaugural Session, the first thematic session of the National Seminar was conducted in the Seminar Hall of the School of Pedagogical Sciences at 11:30 am. Dr. Ismail Thamarasseri, Assistant Professor, School of Pedagogical Sciences chaired the session and introduced the theme of the session "Changing Roles of Teachers in the Present Scenario". He

introduced the resource person of the session, Prof. (Dr.) Mohandas B. Menon, by giving a short biography. Prof. (Dr.) Mohandas B. Menon was the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) of Wawasan Open University Malaysia, Former Professor/Director of School of Education at IGNOU and Former Chairman of National Institute of Open Schooling-NIOS. He started the session by mentioning the role of teachers in the present scenario. He pointed out the significance of various Education Commissions and NEP 2020. He said that the purpose of education is to prepare young people for life, work and citizenship. Teachers, heedless of their expertise and experience, should have to re-examine himself/herself with the current scenario. He also highlighted the significance of instructional design as a broader term. Three things a teacher should cater are: Technology, Education and Design. In the present scenario there are many opportunities for change. We are willing to think out-of-the-box. There is much openness among all stakeholders. He stated that we have broadened the vision of a blended learning community. He concluded the session by mentioning the challenges which are to be changed in the field of education. After the thematic presentation, a discussion session followed. Prof. Dr. Jaya Jaise presented a memento to Prof. Dr. Mohandas B Menon. Sr. Bindhumol T, Research Scholar proposed the vote of thanks and the session was adjourned for lunch at 12:50 pm. The entire events were documented by Ms. Sheril Sara Thomson, M. Ed Student.



















THEMATIC SESSION 2 (01/03/2023 at 01:30 pm)

After lunch, at 01:30 pm, the second thematic session of the national seminar was conducted at the seminar hall of the School of Pedagogical Sciences. Dr. Sibu G. Netto chaired the session and welcomed the gathering and the resource person, Dr. Toney K. Thomas, Head of School of Tourism Studies, Mahatma Gandhi University. He introduced the topic of the session "Changing Perspective of OBE in Youth Employment- Adaptive or Resistive Responses?". Dr. Toney K. Thomas presented on the topic where he focused on one key issue of youth employment. The talk was based on his own reflective thoughts. Another major concern he put forward is the massification of education. He also discussed about flexible education, free entry and exit and pointed out that education is transforming according to the needs and interest of the society. By pointing on the vision of Harvard Business School and how OBE is related to this business school, he mentioned on OBE expectations vs what is assessed. Youth unemployment rate remains significantly higher than overall unemployment with a rate of 5.4%. He concluded by mentioning 2nd transcript which enhances desirable learning. This transcript consists of experimental series and experiential series. In the feedback session, Dr. Joju John posed a question where he asked about the practical possibilities of developing attitudes and skills among students. After the session, a memento was presented to Dr. Toney K Thomas by Prof. Dr. Jaya Jaise as a token of gratitude. A note of thanks was proposed by Ms. Asha Mohanan, Research Scholar. The session was followed by a tea break at 2:15 pm.














Paper Presentations




