Report of the Workshop on *Administration of Psychological Tools for Educational Diagnosis & Testing* dated 4th September 2024

The workshop on the Administration of Psychological Tools for Educational Diagnosis & Testing was organized by the School of Pedagogical Sciences (SPS) at Mahatma Gandhi University (MGU). Special Session: "Tools Vs Techniques in Psychology" by Dr. Muhammed K V: Dr. Muhammed K V, started with a life related experience as an example as how to know the learner. He explained how tools are the instruments used to gather data, while techniques refer to the methods applied in analyzing and interpreting this data. Dr. Muhammed emphasized the importance of both elements in effective psychological assessment and provided examples of how each contributes to understanding educational issues. Differentiated between tools and techniques.

Session 1: "Psychological Tools and their Practical Application" by Ms. Naseeha Nazeer: In this session, Ms. Naseeha Nazeer introduced various psychological tools used in educational settings. To distinguish between psychological tools and techniques, how each tool can be utilised to meet specific educational assessment goals, while to gain hands-on experience explore and analysis psychological tools. Made the students to divide into 08 groups and give each intelligence test to each team, and wants to present in a brief manner about the test, its components, and examples. Gave more activities using the test. Everyone actively participated in all the activities. After that a new test was given to find the reading age. She covered the theoretical background of these tools and demonstrated their practical applications. Participants learned about different assessment instruments, such as questionnaires, tests, and observational tools, and how to use them to evaluate student performance and needs.

Session 2: "Hands-on Practice on Designing and Preparing Various Tools" by Ms. Naseeha Nazeer: Building on the previous session, Ms. Naseeha Nazeer guided participants through a hands-on practice session. Attendees were divided into groups and tasked with designing and preparing their own psychological tools. The lab visit provided an opportunity to see the practical application of the tools discussed earlier and to understand the setup and functioning of a professional psychology lab.
